Budget Meeting called to order at 5:00 pm by Amy Mullins

# II. Budget Hearing Presentation-Amy Kopp

- Thanks given to the committee.
- Celebration of school's standing #5 best elementary school in NH
  - o Only northern school within the top ten
- Budgetary factors through the last few years
  - o Insurance
  - o Retirement
  - Cost of living increase
- 3.94% increase
  - Fixed and contractual costs 84% of that increase → Out of the control of the school.
    - Fuel costs
    - Salaries
    - maintenance
  - o 16% within our control.
- Enrollment steady → projected to increase from 95 to 102
- Items above 3%
  - o Special Education
    - Regular Education line item decreased due to para being moved to support special education

- Instructional Program → Theater
- o Student Activities decrease (no outdoor ed)
- Speech Services
  - Salary & Benefits
  - Tools
- Staff Development Decrease
  - Utilizing grant money to meet contractual
- o Library, Enrichment, Technology Integration, and IT → Increase
  - Salaries, Benefits
  - Furniture update
- School board
- SAU Services
- o Field Trip Transportation
  - Gas prices
- o Food Program
  - Free and Reduced only for qualifying

# III. Open Floor for Public Input.

- Started off with the public applauding Veteran's Day Assembly
- Question
  - o Nick DeMayo, Sugar Hill-What is the average cost per student at other schools
    - NH Ed puts out information on all districts → iReports
  - o Karen-Kindergarten Aid and Adequacy line
    - Credit removed from last year → SWEPT was less
    - Not a re-occurring expectation
  - o <u>Brenda, Sugar Hill</u>. -SAU Services, 22,000 New Position. Lafayette is paying a portion. How many others are contributing? What is the total SAU portion? → 100,000 more → new position including position and benefits. There was a need for this position.
    - Concern was around the \$300 increase in taxes.
    - Concern that cuts are not being done enough.
  - Lafayette has done a very serious and responsible job with this budget. It is higher than expected, but understandable with the increase in everything.
  - o Nick DeMayo, Sugar Hill-What do the teachers pay into their pension?-9%
  - o Brenda, Sugar Hill. Who decides how everything is broken up/split up?
